WHAT IS MICC?

Model International Criminal Court (MICC) is a simulation of trials before the ICC for high-school and university students from all over the world.

The International Criminal Court (ICC) is the world's most sophisticated mechanism for the protection of Human Rights and rules of warfare. MICC is a project that aims to teach core principles of the ICC to high-school and university students.

MICC has been growing successfully since 2005 and we owe it to the quality of the training, focus on most relevant topics and a unique experience MICC provides.

The working language of every simulation is English, and every session comprises sets of trainings, discussions and workshops with a simulation of the ICC process – preparation, trial and verdict. Bringing in students from all around the globe, MICC fosters intercultural dialogue and understanding among students of various national and social backgrounds. The goal of this work is to encourage students to study human rights and humanitarian law.

WHO CAN APPLY

Students of law/international relations and journalism or students with journalistic background can register for MICC University. For the simulation, teams of four students can register from one university. The final selection of participating teams will be made on the basis of the CVs and letters of motivation submitted. The student teams should be legally advised and coordinated by a professor from their home university, but the coordinating professor is not accompanying the group to the project.

MEETING PLACE

The training course is going to take place in the International Youth Meeting Center Krzyżowa in Poland. Krzyżowa/Kreisau is a historical site. During World War II it was the meeting place of the Kreisau Circle, an important resistance group against the Nazi regime. Nowadays, the aim of Krzyżowa is supporting peaceful and tolerant existence of nations, social groups and individuals in Europe. The educational work in Krzyżowa builds bridges between the past and the present, between Western and Eastern Europe, and promotes dialogue between generations.

PARTICIPATION FEE

The participation fee for MICC University is differentiated by regions. Please look up the fees due in the table below.

The fees cover accommodation (hostels) and three meals/day, coffee breaks, preparation materials, as well as legal training sessions.

However, in order to actively engage in MICC it is necessary that your knowledge of English is C1 and above.
- 3. Motivation to participate in MICC University (please not more than 1.000 characters):** Outlining the group's motivation for participating and ways in which the participants think of spreading the knowledge and insights gained at MICC in their university/town/region (through projects, newspapers, information days, etc.)
